

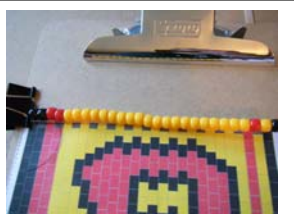
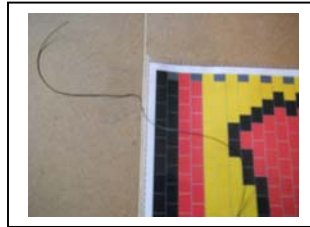
Peyote Stitch Beaded Banner Instructions

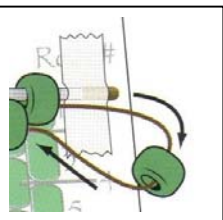
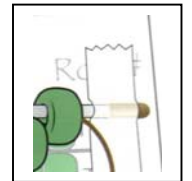
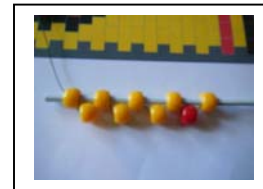

Attach pattern to work surface using tape or binder clips. Cut a 24-36 inch piece of thread (length you are comfortable working with) then attach one end of thread (about 6") to the left of the top row of your pattern using tape or binder clip.



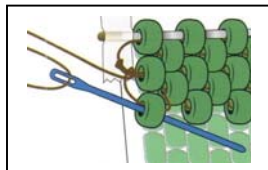
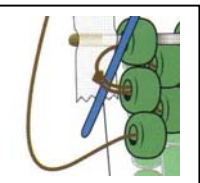
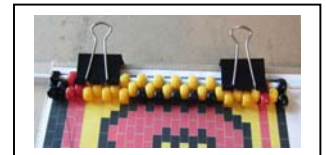
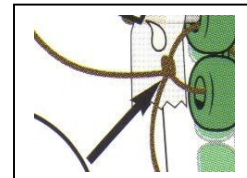
Thread the other end through the needle. Following the pattern, thread beads from the first and second row of your pattern onto the thread, alternating rows. For example, thread bead 1 from first row, then bead 1 from second row, bead 2 from first row, bead 2 from the second row, etc., across to the end.

Take end cap off one end of rod and from the right slide it through every other bead across the row to form rows 1 and 2. Replace end cap. Tape both ends of rod to work surface close to end beads.



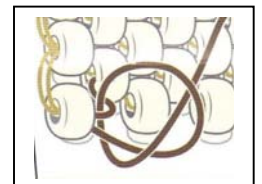
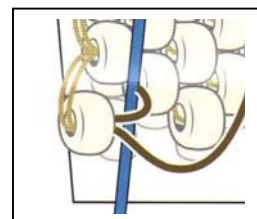
Thread first bead for row 3 onto needle and pass thread through 1st bead of row 2. Continue across the row following pattern and pulling thread taut. Remove tape from rods.

Remove thread from tape or clip and tie threads together in a knot. Thread short end onto needle and pass through several beads on back of banner. Trim excess. Attach banner to work surface by taping rods or by attaching with binder clips to clipboard. Rethread needle and pass thread through last bead of row 3 and continue beading across rows 4 and 5.



After stringing last bead of row 5, pass needle up through the outer edge thread of previous row and then back down through the last bead you added. This will be done at the end of each row on the left side. Continue beading all rows. To start a new piece of thread, tie the two pieces together in a knot and then thread the excess through several beads on the back of the banner. Trim excess.

When you have threaded the last bead on the last row, pass needle up through thread as in previous rows and back through last bead; then pass needle through thread and back through itself to make a knot. Do this twice. Weave excess thread through several beads on back of banner and cut. Attach hanging cord to end of each rod by tying knots.
